




Report on Seminar on ^{ABC of} G20

On November 27, 2023, the Political Science Department hosted an insightful seminar on the topic of the Hobbesian Social Contract. The event was presided over by the esteemed principal, Professor Bipin Chowdhury. The resource person for the seminar was Dr. K. Agrawal, former Reader in Political Science at Sarbati Devi Women's College, Rajgangpur. The seminar witnessed active participation from final-year students and faculty members.

The seminar began with an introduction by Professor Chowdhury, who emphasized the importance of understanding social contract theories in the context of modern political science. He highlighted the relevance of Thomas Hobbes' ideas, particularly in understanding the foundation of political authority and social order.


Dr. K. Agrawal then took the stage and provided a comprehensive overview of Hobbesian philosophy. He explained Hobbes' view of human nature as fundamentally self-interested and how this perspective led to the formulation of the social contract. According to Hobbes, in the absence of a common power to keep individuals in check, life would be "solitary, poor, nasty, brutish, and short." Therefore, individuals collectively agreed to surrender some of their freedoms to a sovereign authority in exchange for security and order.

Following Dr. Agrawal's detailed exposition, the seminar moved on to paper presentations by final-year students Sweety Dagal, Rakhi Dharwa, and Sankranti Sahu. Their papers delved into various aspects of Hobbesian theory, including its historical context, its impact on subsequent political thought, and its contemporary relevance. The presentations were well-researched and sparked engaging discussions among the attendees.

Miss Anila Toppo, Lecturer in Political Science, also shared her views on the topic. She discussed the criticisms of Hobbes' theory, particularly the perceived pessimism about human nature and the potential for authoritarianism inherent in his model of an absolute sovereign. Her insights provided a balanced perspective, enriching the seminar's discourse.

Principal Professor Bipin Chowdhury concluded the seminar by sharing his valuable ideas on the topic. He appreciated the students' efforts and encouraged them to continue exploring philosophical theories to better understand current political structures and issues.
